(CPEI)

The online and asynchronous Professional Certificate in Interpreting Studies (CPEI) prepares students to enter and to excel as interpreters in the medical, community, legal and conference contexts. CPEI consists of five graduate level courses. These were designed balancing the growing academic literature in Interpreting Studies along with the professional realities and practices.

Despite its asynchronous nature, assignments are designed to foster a community where students learn from the different interpreting contexts, skills and perspectives of their peers. CPEI's course activities and materials take into consideration the challenges and opportunities posed by the wide international contexts. Additionally, CPEI incorporates critical analysis, emotional intelligence, applied ethics, and history of interpreting as part of its methodological approaches where the interpreter is viewed with agency.

Courses

The certificate consists of five graduate courses:

- (TRAD 6201) Introduction to Interpreting
- (TRAD 6202) Introduction to Community Interpreting
- (TRAD 6203) Introduction to Medical Interpreting
- (TRAD 6204) Introduction to Conference Interpreting
- (TRAD 6205) Interpreting Practice
